# **ABOUT US**

Snehalaya - Centre for Persons in need of Special Care is a Thane based registered voluntary Non-Profit Non-Governmental Organization involved in the training, day care and rehabilitation of *Persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities or Specially Abled or Differently Abled*.

Registered in January 2006, Snehalaya started activity in June 2007. Snehalaya accommodated up to 25 individuals in the previous year, all above the age of 16 years, under day-care and vocational skill development.

Snehalaya is a secular trust, with audited accounts till date, and is registered under Maharashtra Public Trust Act 1950, with Charity Commissioner, under Persons with Disability Act 1995 (now RPD Act 2016), and with The National Trust, Government of India, Delhi. Snehalaya is also, a member of Parivaar – National Confederation of Parents Association at the national level consisting of more than 300 members, and a member of Parivaar Sahyadri consisting of 48 members at State Level.

Snehalaya provides a safe space for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, after graduating from special schools (i.e., post 18, or some cases 15). We aim to help exploring their potential and abilities, so they can channelise and utilise them to its fullest.

#### National Convention of Self Advocates Forum of India concludes

The two day National Convention of Self Advocates' Forum of India (SAFI) concluded on Sunday at the Education Training and Service Centre, ETC, Vashi, Navi Mumbai. IN a press release the National Coordinator of SAFI, Mr P.S. Burde informed that SAFI is the only registered organization of Persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities across the country and having its presence in 31 states. The convention was organised by Parivaar, National Confederation of Parents Organizations in association with CBM, National Institute of Empowerment of Persons with Intellectual Disability and Municipal Corporation of Navi Mumbai.

Dr Sara Verughese, Managing Trustee of CBM India in her inaugural speech said that CBM has always been with SAFI in promoting their empowerment and livelihood to make them self-sustainable. Dr. Pankaj Maru, National President, Parivaar expressed the commitment of PARIVAAR for spreading SAFI movement across the country and supported the Govt. of India in developing mentors for giving the training to PwIDDS to make them self-advocates. The 2 days convention was inaugurated by the guests including Ms Aditi Verma, National President SAFI, Mr Shiva Shrestha, Asia Pacific representative of Inclusion In-

ternational, Dr. Yogesh Dubey, Chairman Bhartiya Vikas Sansthan, Dr Ravi Prakash Singh, Incharge, Regional Centre, NIEPID, Anand Mehta, Prominent Motivational speaker. Ms Aditi Verma, President, Self Advocates' Forum of India narrated the progress of self advocacy movement and how Self Advocates' Forum of India has evolved from a small group of persons with Intellectual Disabilities to a National organization.

Over 300 persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities and their supporters from 21 states participated in the convention.

The theme of this year's Convention was "With Us Not For Us". Some of the Self Advocates spoke on the theme and expressed their opinion.

The two day convention had the General Assembly of self advocates Forum of India in the form of Annual General Meet, Open house session. During this session Self Advocates engaged in Livelihood Project being implemented in some states have shared their experience. The election of the new Executive Council of SAFI was also held during the convention.

There was a planetary session that provided experiential knowledge to self advocates for team building, leadership, social inclusion and participation. Mr. Amit Patle elected as new President of SAFI by the Self Advocates.





o 21<sup>st</sup> *March 2023:* World Down Syndrome Day was celebrated by Snehalaya. Rangoli was made at the centre, with PwIDDs helping the teachers. Snehalaya premises was decorated in yellow and bluw, and a rally was organised in area, spreading awareness. All parents and PwIDDs participated with great enthusiasm.
